About the Guest Clinician



Ross Harbaugh is Professor of Cello at the University of Miami's Frost School of Music, and cellist of the Bergonzi String Quartet. His distinguished teachers include Janos Starker and Leonard Rose in the United States and Andre Navarra at the Paris Conservatory, and chamber music study with the Juilliard Quartet. As a founding member of the New World Quartet he won the Naumburg Prize, a Prix du Disque, recorded 14 albums and CD's for Vox, MCI Classic and IMP Masters, and performed throughout Europe and the United States. He has appeared in concerts at the Kennedy Center, Alice Tully Hall, and Wigmore Hall in London, and has concertized with such artists as Leonard Rose, Bill Preucil and the Guarneri Quartet. He has soloed with the Atlanta Symphony, Cincinnati and Toledo Symphonies along many others, and appears nationally with orchestras and in recital each year. His teaching experience includes stints at Harvard University, University of Michigan and Inerlochen. Mr. Harbaugh presents workshops in ensemble communication and gives cello masterclasses throughout the country. He has authored numerous articles for American String Teacher, the Strad and appears regularly on National Public Radio.
